The Burbank Recycle Center is located at 500 S. Flower Street in Burbank, CA and can be reached at (818)238-3900. It's owned by the City of Burbank and is a private and public partnership between the City and Burbank Recycling, which is a privately owned company that specializes in the processing and marketing of recyclable materials. The Burbank Recycle Center is by far the best place to go for recycling, even if you are not a resident of Burbank. They open early at 8:00 a.m., have helpful staff, and there is never a wait. They accept all types of materials for recycling, like plastic, paper, aluminum cans, bottles, jars, plastics and electronics. The Recycle Center is a sorting facility where materials are separated, packed, and shipped to areas all over the world that processes recyclables. Recycling is good but Reduce/Reuse is better! They want Burbank residents to revive the lost art of repair and experience less consumption. Learning how to fix items is the perfect way to reinforce this idea. Kreigh Hampel is the Recycling Coordinator, and he and his staff promote "The Three R's of Sustainability: Reduce Reuse Recycle!" Stop by sometime to visit the Recycling Tree of Life which was created in 1997 by a local artist and is located in the Center. Come to the meeting on October 22nd and find out how you can recycle more in your households and make a little money on the side!
