presented at our annual picnic at Vasona. In addition to a framed certificate of appreciation, a check is given which covers one year's worth of RPEA dues. This year, the award was gratefully given to Mary Chaboya.

Mary Chaboya began working for the Santa Clara County Social Services Agency in 1974. She worked her way up to being a Program Manager responsible for the eligibility workers and supervisors who administered aid to children in the county's foster care program. In 2000 she had the honor of being loaned to the state for eight years to help develop the new automated computer system for eligibility and aid payments to people receiving "welfare." She served as the expert on the foster care component of the system. Notably, this required her to relocate to Sacramento for eight years.

Mary retired in 2008. She became an RPEA Chapter 031 member in March of 2009 and she began volunteering at the information desk at 70 West Hedding the very next month, in April! For the last three years she has helped to coordinate the information desk as well as the schedulers, and has been responsible for keeping the desk stocked with supplies. She is also the liaison between the information desk and the Chapter's board. She serves on the board of

Chapter 031 and began as the "Sunshine Person" at the beginning of the 2013-14 fiscal year. She sends cards to the families of deceased RPEA chapter members and sends get well cards when she becomes aware that a member is ill. She is always ready and willing to pitch in and help with any task. She even volunteered her home when Harry's Hof Brau closed and the board needed a place to meet.

Mary has a grown son and daughter. She has two granddaughters by her daughter, and her son and daughter-in-law just had their baby, Mary's third grandchild. Mary loves to travel and always looks like she's ready for a beach day! Thank you, Mary, for your dedication to our Chapter, and congratulations on your well-earned award.
