#### **CALPERS LONG-TERM CARE (LTC) CLASS ACTION LAWSUIT**

After the court denied CalPERS' request to have the lawsuit thrown out, the judge ruled that it would be a class-action covering those who had purchased LTC insurance from 1995-2004 [LTC1 and LTC2] and who had also purchased inflation protection and/or lifetime benefits.

The lawsuit alleges Breach of Contract—that CalPERS promised its policy holders premiums were fixed for life and would never rise. To avoid proposed rate hikes of as much as 85%, affected policy holders were given options to take reduced benefits.

In 2018, Towers Watson mailed out individual checks as a partial settlement in their part of the lawsuit; then claims asserted against CalPERS went forward. [Note: There is a set deadline to cash the check; so if you received one, don't delay in cashing it!]

The \$1.2 billion suit, known as Elma Sanchez vs. CalPERS, could affect up to 100,000 seniors. The amount of damages is one of the issues to be addressed at trial.

The trial, taking place in L.A. County Superior Court, was broken up into three phases. The <u>Phase 1</u> court trial took place on June 10-11 when the judge found that while CalPERS had a general right to increase premiums on a class-wide basis, it was prohibited to do so "as a result of" the inflation protection benefit. He found that a jury should determine whether all or part of the 85% increase was "as a result of" inflation protection and thus would mean CalPERS breached the contract. CalPERS therefore did not prevail in its inflation protection defense.

In <u>Phase 2</u>, CalPERS argued that since it increased premiums several times between 2003 and 2013, seniors who wanted to file a lawsuit should have done so earlier. The judge ruled against CalPERS as a matter of law. Since the only damages being sought in the suit are based on the 2015-2016 85% premium increase, the case could not have been filed years earlier.

In <u>Phase 3</u>, the lawsuit—absent a settlement—will proceed to a jury trial related to the potential breach of contract; any damages would be determined then.

The parties have agreed to mediation on September 4 and October 7 to try to resolve the matter. The Court has scheduled the jury trial (Phase 3) to begin on October 30 should the matter not be settled.




