Message from the President


Good day all!

Important Information for CalPERS Retirees


Enclosed in this newsletter is the paperwork for a Special Power of Attorney form for CalPERS. This is a voluntary form intended to assist you in managing your CalPERS retirement account. It is not mandatory. It is intended to help you and your trusted family member(s) should you become incapacitated or otherwise unable to manage your own affairs in the future.

Scams Abound!

Oh my, the scammers are out in full force this year. My own credit union has had to post a warning on their website that some vile person or group is sending out text messages to members with a link to "update your information."

A few hints to avoid helping these criminals steal your money:

- 1) Never, ever, ever open the link or reply to a text message or email. Go to your computer and pull up the real website, or go in person or call your bank using the contact information on your statement. This also applies to your phone and utility bills, even if the message is threatening to cut off your service! When it comes to your money, don't trust anyone who just contacts you out of the blue, no matter how "real" they seem.
- 2) Check the email address. Ninety-nine times out of a hundred, it's clearly a scammer with a weird email address and not your bank, PayPal, Venmo, Cash App, utility company, employer, family member or friend. Also look for misspellings and



- poor grammar. Just mark it as "spam" and send it off to the graveyard of fake emails the
- 3) The same applies to telephone calls. No matter how real they sound, or if they're demanding or yelling at you, tell them that you're in the middle of something and you'll call back in a few minutes. Again, use the contact information on your statement. Never use the phone number or web address that they so "helpfully" provide to you.
- 4) The police, sheriff and other law enforcement will never, ever call you about a warrant for your arrest. The police prefer to be a horrible surprise on your doorstep if there really is a warrant. They aren't going to call you for donations either — it's a scam!
- 5) Any time the caller, text or email demands that you go purchase gift cards, or asks for your credit card or bank account for payment, just stop. Again, it's a scam!
- 6) Avoid getting scam calls by setting your cell phone to silence all unknown numbers. Don't answer phone numbers you don't recognize. If it's important, they'll leave a message. (Please do set up your voicemail!)
- 7) Last, but not least, unless it's the tamale man/lady, FedEx or UPS, or you know the person on your doorstep, don't even answer the door to door-to-door salespeople. And if you do, take the brochure if you like, but don't let them in — Just say no and shut the door.

Attorney(s)-in-fact may not conduct business by accessing your online mylCalPERS account. All contact with CalPERS on your behalf must be made by telephone, by written correspondence, or by visiting a Regional Office.

The "agent" is the attorney-in-fact.

Warning Statements

The authority granted by the CalPERS **Special Power of Attorney** form is limited to matters relating to CalPERS, JRS I, JRS II, and LRS. The person designated as your attorney-in-fact does not have any authority over your other real and/or personal property. If you wish that your attorney-in-fact have authority over your real and/or personal property, it is recommended that you seek legal counsel.

You may notice that the language contained in the following Warning Statements refers to more extensive authority than granted by the CalPERS Special Power of Attorney form. These Warning Statements are required by Probate Code section 4128 and must be included in all preprinted durable power of attorney forms even though the CalPERS Special Power of Attorney form does not authorize your attorney-in-fact to do many of the things mentioned in the Warning Statements. If you are concerned with the Warning Statements or the extent of the authority being granted by the CalPERS Special Power of Attorney form, we again recommend that you seek legal counsel.

(Warning): Notice to Person Executing Durable Power of Attorney

A durable power of attorney is an important legal document. By signing a durable power of attorney, you are authorizing another person to act for you, the principal. Before you sign this durable power of attorney, you should know these important facts:

- Your agent (attorney-in-fact) has no duty to act unless you and your agent agree otherwise in writing.
- This document gives your agent the powers to manage, dispose of, sell, and convey your real and
 personal property, and to use your property as security if your agent borrows money on your behalf.
 This document does not give your agent the power to accept or receive any of your property, in
 trust or otherwise, as a gift, unless you specifically authorize the agent to accept or receive a gift.
- Your agent will have the right to receive reasonable payment for services provided under this
 durable power of attorney unless you state otherwise in this power of attorney.
- The powers you give your agent will continue to exist for your entire lifetime, unless you state
 that the durable power of attorney will last for a shorter period of time or unless you otherwise
 terminate the durable power of attorney. The powers you give your agent in this durable power
 of attorney will continue to exist even if you can no longer make your own decisions regarding
 the management of your property.
- You can amend or change this durable power of attorney only by executing a new durable power
 of attorney or by executing an amendment through the same formalities as an original. You have
 the right to revoke or terminate this power of attorney at any time as long as you are competent.
- This durable power of attorney must be dated and must be acknowledged before a notary
 public or signed by two witnesses. If it is signed by two witnesses, they must witness either
 (1) the principal's signing of the power of attorney or (2) the principal's acknowledgement of his
 or her signature. A durable power of attorney that may affect real property should be acknowledged
 before a notary public so that it can easily be recorded.
- You should read this durable power of attorney carefully. When effective, this durable power of
 attorney will give your agent the right to deal with property that you now have or might acquire
 in the future. This durable power of attorney is important to you. If you do not understand the
 durable power of attorney or any provision of it, you should obtain the assistance of an attorney
 or other qualified person.

Privacy Notice

The privacy of personal information is of the utmost importance to CalPERS.

The following information is provided to you in compliance with the Information Practices Act of 1977 and the Federal Privacy Act of 1974.

Information Purpose

The information requested is collected pursuant to the Government Code (sections 20000 et seq.) and will be used for administration of Board duties under the Retirement Law, the Social Security Act, and the Public Employees' Medical and Hospital Care Act, as the case may be. Submission of the requested information is mandatory. Failure to comply may result in CalPERS being unable to perform its functions regarding your status.

Please do not include information that is not requested.

Social Security Numbers

Social Security numbers are collected on a mandatory and voluntary basis. If this is CalPERS' first request for disclosure of your Social Security number, then disclosure is mandatory. If your Social Security number has already been provided, disclosure is voluntary. Due to the use of Social Security numbers by other agencies for identification purposes, we may be unable to verify eligibility for benefits without the number.

Social Security numbers are used for the following purposes:

- 1. Enrollee identification
- 2. Payroll deduction/state contributions
- Billing of contracting agencies for employee/ employer contributions
- Reports to CalPERS and other state agencies
- 5. Coordination of benefits among carriers
- Resolving member appeals, complaints, or grievances with health plan carriers

Information Disclosure

Portions of this information may be transferred to other state agencies (such as your employer), physicians, and insurance carriers, but only in strict accordance with current statutes regarding confidentiality.

Your Rights
